The Market Square

The thriving Dobczyce Market Square is an example of a classic linear settlement. It was created at the foot of The Old Town Hill in 1768, after the town was moved to the Raba River valley. Of the historical buildings only a few 19th century wooden houses were preserved. The structures around the market square include: church, the Voluntary Fire Service Watchtower and baroque statue of St. Florian from 1768.

The ruins of medieval royal castle

The ruins of the 13th century royal castle, proudly sitting on a steep rock above the waters of Dobczyckie Lake. It was formerly an impressive upland stronghold, inaccessible due to its location - with a precipice over the Raba River on one side and a deep moat on the other. However, over the following centuries it was affected by numerous wars and its existence was ultimately ended by treasure seekers.

The Open-air Museum of Wooden Folk Architecture

The open-air museum consists of some 19th century wooden buildings of various purposes and a number of diverse exhibitions. It is a great place to learn about the traditions and customs of Dobczyce Land. You can view the funeral home with its over one-hundred-year-old hearth, a hen house, a granary and an inn from 1830.

The John the Baptist Church

This classical church from 1828 is a single-nave structure, erected on the site of earlier churches, with the first one probably dating from the 13th century. Inside you can see the marble headstone epitaph of Sebastian Lubomirski's child from 16th century and the 17th century Stations of the Cross. Standing next to the church is a 19th century arcade bell tower, resembling a triple triumphal arch. The oldest bell (in the middle) is known as "John" and dates back to 1504.

The City Walls

About 700 m long and 1.5 m thick, the wall surrounding Castle Hill was shaped like an irregular pentagon. It had crenels and battlements, as well as a gallery for the guards, which helped to effectively defend the town. In 2013, a number of works based on archaeological studies were completed, and as a result we can now see a reconstructed tower and the eastern section of the city wall.

The Dobczyckie Lake

The Raba River was dammed to form Dobczyckie Lake. The earth and concrete dam is 30 m tall and 617 m long, and at its foot there is a small, 2500 KW hydropower plant. The decision to build the dam was taken in 1970, and entailed removing about 216 farms and homesteads from flood plain. The reservoir covers an area of 10.7 km² and is a source of drinking water for Kraków. You may reach the top of the dam from the parking on Budowlanych Street but swimming in the lake is prohibited.
